The Selectboard of the Town of Carroll does hereby promulgate and enact the following ordinance (s);

There shall be no open containers of alcoholic beverages in ANY public place within the Town of Carroll. Ordinance shall not prohibit nor supercede the Board of Selectmen's authority to issue permits for the use and consumption of alcoholic beverages in or on properties owned by the Town of Carroll. Public place shall include but not be limited to; highways, streets, roads, sidewalks, parks, playgrounds, hallways within apartment buildings, beaches used for recreational purposes, and other similar locations.

- a) Any violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$155.00
- b) Any subsequent violation of this ordinance within 12 calendar months of the first violation shall be subject to a fine of \$200.00

This ordinance shall not be deemed to prohibit the Town Of Carroll Emergency Personnel (such as police and fire departments, etc.) from use of these machines within the scope of their duties.

- a) Any violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$100.00
- b) Any subsequent violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$150.00

- 1) No motorized vehicles of any kind (including, but not limited to, Motor vehicles, ATVs, OHRVS, dirt bikes, etc.) shall allowed in the beach area, playing fields, and designated no parking areas of the Town Recreation Area Property.
 - a) Any violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$100.00 for being within any of the above listed areas except a designated no parking zone
 - b) Any violation of this ordinance by being in a designated no parking zone shall be subject to a fine of \$30.00

There shall be no overnight camping on any Town owned property. Camping overnight shall be defined as sleeping or staying overnight in any vehicle, recreational vehicle, tent, tent like structure, or sleeping overnight in the open. Nothing in this ordinance shall prohibit the Board of Selectmen from issuing a permit for such activities in a special event.

- a) Any violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$50.00

No vehicle shall be operated within the Town of Carroll in such a manner as to create the spinning of tires, or an excessively noisy or disruptive manner. This shall include the over revving of a vehicles' motor in the event of rapid and unnecessary acceleration. No person shall operate a vehicle within the Town of Carroll so that the lives and safety of any person may be at risk.

- a) Any violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$100.00 and no more than \$1000.00

This Ordinance requires the acceptance of the people of the Town of Carroll by vote at Town Meeting

- a) Any violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a \$50.00 fine
- b) Any subsequent violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$100.00

Construction Equipment, woods operation equipment, and general construction within the Town of Carroll shall not commence prior to 8:00 a.m on any given day unless a permit for such earlier operation has been obtained from the Board of Selectmen. Any permit given by the Selectmen shall only be done if there is no objection given by any abutting landowners to said operation. It shall be the responsibility of the requesting party for such permit to notify all abutters that they will be seeking said permit.

- a) Any violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a \$50.00 fine
- b) Any subsequent violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine increase of \$50.00 per subsequent offense per day of operation in violation of this ordinance

This ordinance requires the approval, by vote, of the people of the Town of Carroll at Town Meeting

No person shall kindle ANY outdoor fire for ANY purpose without a burn permit issued by the Twin Mountain Fire Department or authorized Deputy Warden.

- a) Any violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$35.00
- b) Any subsequent violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$70.00

No person within the Town of Carroll shall ignite nor cause to be ignited any Class C firework (as defined by NH RSA) except between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 p.m. No person within the Town of Carroll shall ignite any firework within the Town of Carroll on any day in which Burn Permits and outdoor burning has been banned due to a high fire danger condition.

- a) Any violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$75.00
- b) Any subsequent violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$150.00

The Selectboard of the Town of Carroll does hereby promulgate and enact the following ordinance (s);

All domestic and commercial refuse shall be placed and contained within one of the following;

- a) A building, house or garage that is inaccessible to wildlife
- b) A wildlife resistant container or commercial dumpster that are secured with a locking mechanism
- c) A container that is placed within a wildlife resistant enclosure

Further any and all refuse placed for curbside pick up shall not be so placed prior to 5:00 a.m. on the actual day of pick up. Also no person shall knowingly feed any of the following wild animals; Deer, bear, moose, fox, skunk, woodchuck, weasel, or beaver. No person shall feed ANY wild animal in a manner that could place the life and safety of said animal or any person in danger.

- a) Any violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$100.00
- b) Any subsequent violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$200.00.

Local Ordinance to establish a street and house numbering system.

PURPOSE -

- A) Identify locations & names of all roads.
- B) Establish a uniform numbering system for all primary buildings located on item A.
- C) To provide more expedient emergency response.

DEFINITION -

- A) Street/Road
A public or private right of way affording primary access by pedestrians and vehicles to and between properties.

PARTIES EFFECTED -

All primary buildings and streets, whether public or private, within the boundaries of the Town of Carroll.

AUTHORITY -

RSA 231:132-a

NUMBERING SYSTEM -

Uniform street numbering has been established based on the following system:

- A) All primary buildings will be numbered
- B) The starting point for Rte 3 North, Rte 3 South, Rte 302 East and Rte 302 West is the intersection of Rte 302 & Rte 3.
- C) The starting point for Rte 115 is the intersection of Rte 3 and Rte 115.
- D) The starting point for Lennon Road is the junction of Route 3 North
- E) The starting point for all other roads is the intersection to Rte 302, Rte 3, Rte 115, or where it intersects another primary road.
- F) The street numbering for each building is determined by its distance, in feet, from the starting point of the road (described in A, B, & C above). The actual street number is assigned by measuring the distance and dropping the last digit. Example: A house is 4,642 feet from its starting point. The street number is 464 (the 2 is dropped)

NUMBERING SYSTEM continued

- G) Condominium complexes, apartment buildings and other properties with multiple primary buildings shall be assigned one street number per primary entrance location. Number methods of these units will be determined by the Board of Selectmen.
- H) All streets, public and private, must have a sign identifying its approved name. (See Appendix A). The Town will supply signs on public roads, owners are responsible for private roads; the signs must be approved by the Board of Selectmen.

PROCEDURES -

- A) All property owners are responsible to identify primary buildings in accordance with this section.
- B) All primary buildings shall display the assigned street number so it is readily visible and readable from the road.
- C) All numbered signs shall be identical to the example in Appendix B or approved by the Board of Selectmen.
- D) Signs and posts will be supplied and installed by the Town.

NEW BUILDINGS -

- A) A Certificate of Occupancy will not be issued until proper numbering is in place.
- B) All Department Heads shall be notified of the addition to update Dispatch Maps.

PENALTY -

- A) Any property owner who fails to comply with is ordinance shall be liable to a fine not to exceed \$250.



PARKING ORDINANCES

In the interest of public safety and welfare, the town of Carroll in accordance with RSA 41:11(47:17(XVIII)), promulgates the following ordinance, as it relates to the use of all public and private roads, ways, alleyways, driveways and parking areas in the Town of Carroll.

- I. 1. It shall be unlawful to park in any area designated as **RESTRICTED** or **NO PARKING ZONE** be it a town or private way.
2. It shall be unlawful to stop, park or block any alleyway, driveway, parking slot, (Public or private), in the Town of Carroll.
3. It shall be unlawful to park within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.
4. It shall be unlawful to park on any sidewalk or crosswalk.
5. It shall be unlawful to park in any place (Public or private) which is specifically designated for the use of the handicapped by means of a sign stating the space is reserved for the physically handicapped or displaying the wheelchair symbol painted on the ground surface.
6. No vehicle shall be stopped or parked so as to constitute double parking except to load or unload passengers or deliveries.
7. It is unlawful to allow any vehicle to stop, stand or park on any public or private way unless there is sufficient space remaining for any other vehicle to pass in safety. (Fire truck, ambulance or any other emergency vehicle).
8. No vehicles shall be parked in the following described areas:
 - A. Hannah Loop. Parking prohibited entire length.
 - B. Base Rd. Parking prohibited from RT 302, Northeast to the intersection with Fairway Drive.
 - C. Fairway Drive. Parking prohibited entire length
 - D. Fairway Drive Extension. Parking prohibited entire length.
 - E. Stickney Way. Parking prohibited entire length.
 - F. Ski Area Road. Parking prohibited entire length, except in designated parking areas.
 - G. Crawford Ridge Rd. Parking prohibited one side only.

- H. Remick Lane. Parking prohibited entire length.
- I. Rosebrook Lane. Parking prohibited except in designated areas.
- J. Forest Lane. Parking prohibited except in designated areas.
- K. Rivers Edge Road. Parking Prohibited entire length.
- L. Zealand Road. Parking prohibited where official US Forest Service signs are posted.
- M. School Street. Parking prohibited where signs are posted.

II. Regulatory signs and markings are to be installed by, or under the authority of the Town of Carroll Police Department.

III. Except as such may be altered by the foregoing, the provisions of RSA 265:68, Rsa 265:69 and RSA 265:71 shall also apply.

IV. PENALTIES

Violation	Fine
NO PARKING ZONE	\$10.00
RESTRICTED PARKING	\$10.00
FIRE LANE	\$10.00
HANDICAPPED PARKING	\$50.00
FIRE HYDRANT	\$25.00
ALL OTHER VIOLATIONS	\$25.00

- A. All fines must be paid within 30 calendar days.
- B. Any person who fails to pay such fines shall be notified by certified mail of such violation: That person then has 5 business days from the date of delivery of such notification to pay all such fines.
- C. Any person still in violation of this section after being duly notified by registered mail, shall be subject to a summons to Lancaster District Court and may be fined not more than \$1,000.00 per violation under RSA 31.39.

APPEALS

- A. Any person who wishes to appeal a parking ticket may do so within 5 business days of the date of issue. Appeals should be dated, in written form, signed by the person filing the appeal, and directed to;
