SAMPLE BALLOT

Article 2. Passage of this article shall override the 10 percent limitation imposed on this appropriation due to the non-recommendation of the Budget Committee. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$700,000 (Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars) for the purchase of and improvements to the Twin Village Plaza located at 601 Route 3 South, for the future home of the Carroll Police Department, and to authorize the issuance of not more than \$600,000 (Six Hundred Thousand Dollars) of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon; furthermore, to authorize the withdrawal of \$100,000 (One Hundred Thousand Dollars) from the New Land and Building Capital Reserve Fund created for this purpose. This purchase is subject to three leases which will remain in effect through the remainder of their terms. Further, to authorize the Selectmen to negotiate renewals of the three existing leases for a period not to exceed five years following the termination of the current leases. **Recommended by the Selectmen. Not Recommended by the Budget Committee. (3/5-ballot vote required)**

Article 3. To raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the First Session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling sum of \$1,574,972 (One Million Five Hundred Seventy Four Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy Two Dollars). **Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

Should this article be defeated; the operating budget shall be \$1,626,773 (One Million Six Hundred Twenty Six Thousand Seven Hundred Seventy Three Dollars) which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$170,000.00 (One Hundred Seventy Thousand Dollars) to purchase a new ambulance to replace the 2002 Ford E-450 currently in use and to purchase a new Zoll cardiac monitor/defibrillation unit to be placed in the ambulance. The full amount is to be taken from the Fire Department and Ambulance Apparatus, Equipment, and Personnel Special Revenue Fund. **No money to be raised from new taxation. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

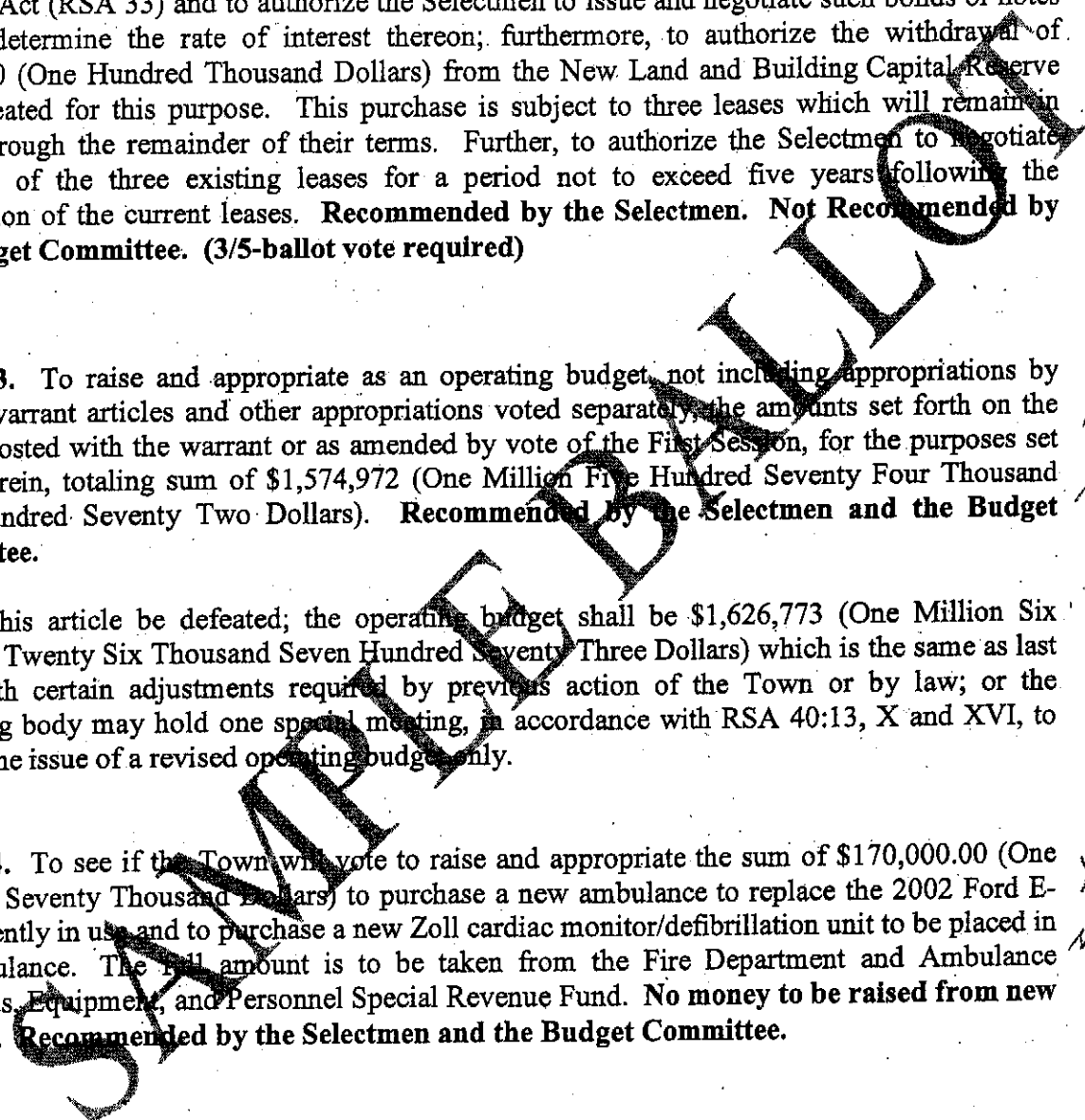
Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,000 (Thirty Seven Thousand Dollars) to purchase a new police cruiser and to fund this appropriation by authorizing the withdrawal of \$25,000 (Twenty Five Thousand Dollars) from the Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund with the balance of \$12,000 (Twelve Thousand Dollars) to come from the Town's Unreserved Fund Balance as of December 31, 2010. **No money to be raised from new taxation. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$19,000 (Nineteen Thousand Dollars) to replace the existing 2002 fire department pick-up. The 2002 pick-up will be used to replace the 1997 fire department forestry vehicle, which is scheduled to be disposed of. The full amount is to be taken from the Fire Department and Ambulance Apparatus, Equipment, and Personnel Special Revenue Fund. **No money to be raised from new taxation. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1 (One Dollar) to be used for Overtime for the Fire/Emergency Department and Police Department and to have this money come from the Town's Unreserved Fund Balance as of December 31, 2010. **No money to be raised from new taxation. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$15,000 (Fifteen Thousand Dollars) for the 2011 tipping of bulky waste and construction debris, the removal of tires, Freon, propane tanks, electronics, florescent light bulbs, and antifreeze, container lease, equipment repair and equipment purchase and further to authorize the withdrawal needed from the Recycling Equipment Special Revenue Fund established at the 2009 Town Meeting for this purpose. **No money will be raised from new taxation. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

Article 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of \$12,000 (Twelve Thousand Dollars) to fund Planning Board, Zoning Board of Appeals and the Property Inspector-Code Enforcement Officer Salary. And further to authorize the withdrawal of such amount from the Planning Special Revenue Fund established in 2006 for that purpose. **No money to be raised from new taxation. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

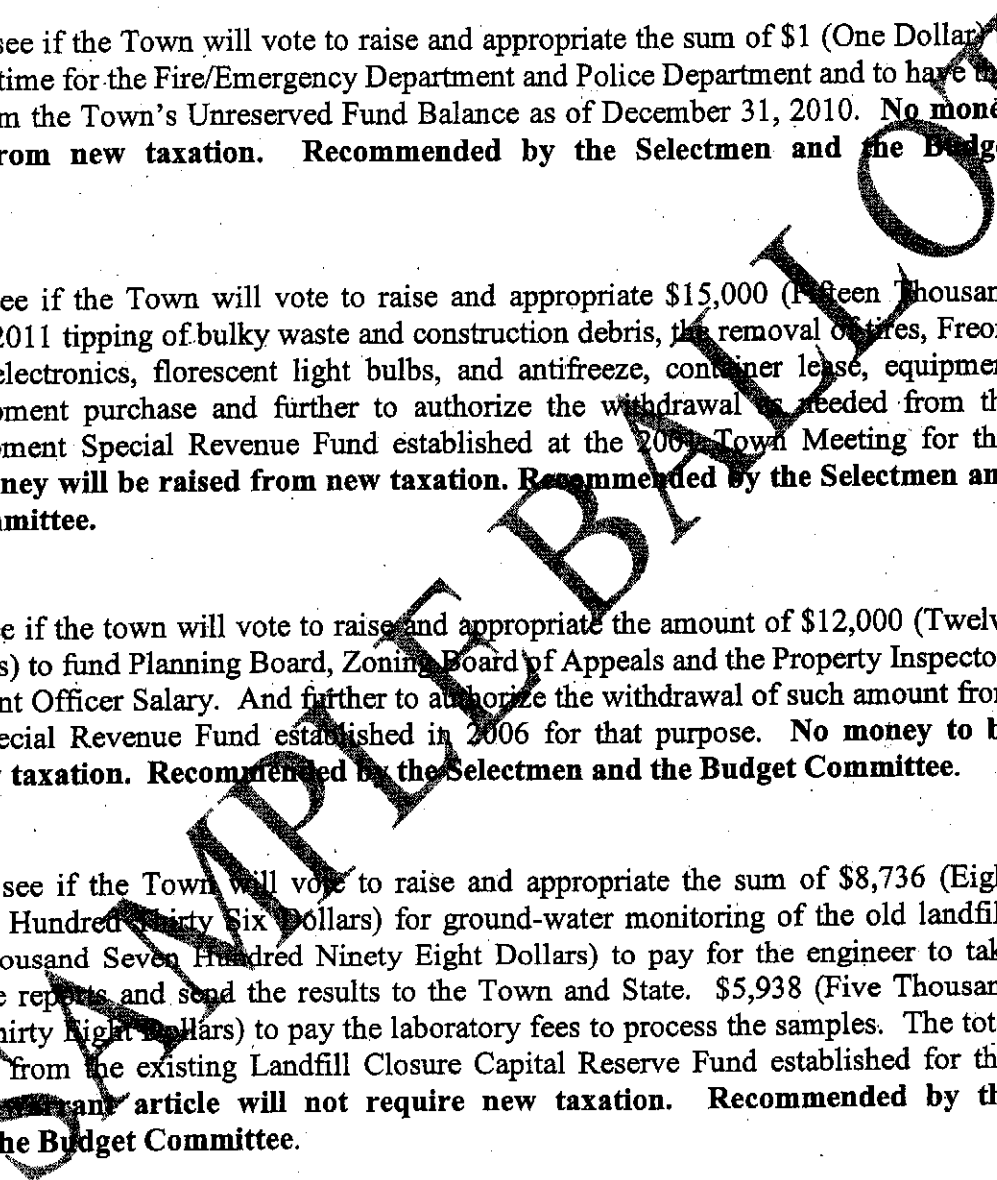

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$8,736 (Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Thirty Six Dollars) for ground-water monitoring of the old landfill. \$2,798 (Two Thousand Seven Hundred Ninety Eight Dollars) to pay for the engineer to take samples, produce reports and send the results to the Town and State. \$5,938 (Five Thousand Nine Hundred Thirty Eight Dollars) to pay the laboratory fees to process the samples. The total amount to come from the existing Landfill Closure Capital Reserve Fund established for this purpose. **This article will not require new taxation. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 (One Thousand Dollars) for maintenance of the old landfill. This includes needs for actual physical maintenance, engineering and overseer expenses. The appropriation will come from the Landfill Closure Capital Reserve Fund established for this purpose. **No money will be raised from new taxation. Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

Article 21. To see if the Town of Carroll will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 (One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars) to hold a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Program. The Program will provide residents access to a Household Hazardous Waste collection of household generated hazardous waste such as oil based paints, paint thinners, solvents, pesticides, gasoline and household cleaners. **Recommended by the Selectmen and the Budget Committee.**

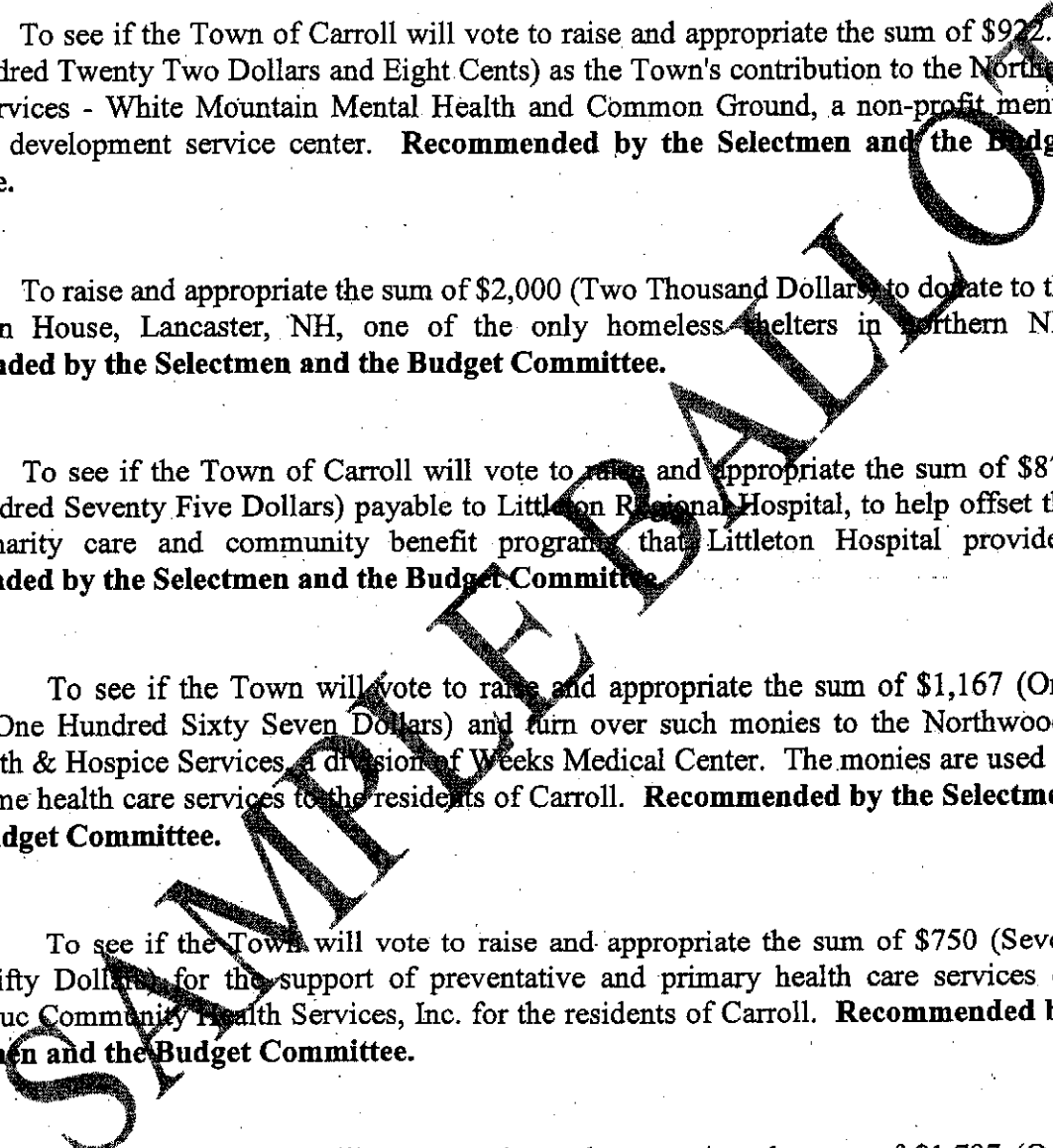

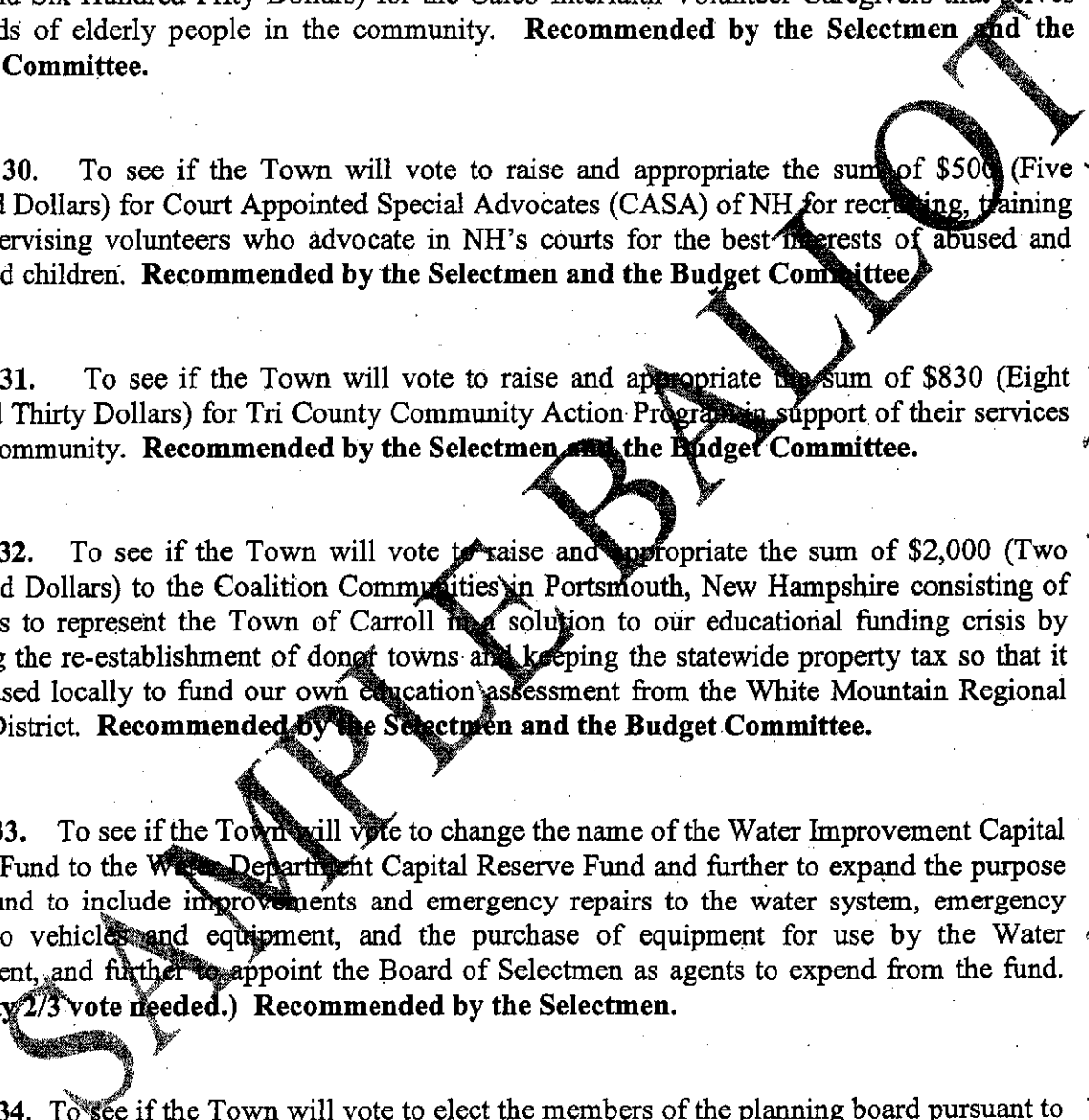
